#### ADDICTION TREATMENT SERVICES

Much is at stake for those suffering from addiction as the path to recovery can be a lengthy and difficult one. Our addiction treatment services utilize a person-centered and individualized approach to help assist those suffering to find their path and stay on it. We know that addiction affects all areas of an individual's life as well as the lives of their families and support systems. That's why our New York State-licensed facilities offer treatment and support for all stages of recovery. The levels of care include a 24-hour residential stabilization center and an outpatient clinic. Services in both incorporate individual and group counseling, psychiatric assessments, medical assessments, medication management, medication-assisted treatment, family/significant other counseling, DWI-mandated treatment, and crisis intervention.

#### HIV/AIDS SERVICES

Although there have been advances in treatment, those with HIV/AIDS still face unique challenges in their day-to-day lives. We are committed to meeting those challenges with respect and compassion for all people, regardless of religious belief or background. We offer special needs housing to low-income families with HIV-ill members that includes social work and case management services. We also maintain cooperative referral relationships with other HIV/AIDS agencies, helping each individual access the assistance they need. All services are confidential and supportive.

#### HOUSING

A lack of affordable housing is one of Long Island's most persistent problems, particularly for the elderly or disabled. Catholic Charities builds and maintains affordable housing to allow those who have contributed so much to the community to remain a part of it. We also work to ensure the physical, social, and spiritual well-being of our residents. Most sites have a social services coordinator who arranges events at each facility and helps residents access services. Catholic Charities also operates a NYS-licensed Adult Care Facility, known as Mary's Manor Enriched Housing, for low-income, frail seniors who need assistance with daily activities, as well as the Thea Bowman Residence for those with physical disabilities. With 1,329 units at 16 sites in Nassau and Suffolk, we keep safe, dignified and affordable housing a part of Long Island in the following communities: Amityville • Brentwood • Central Islip • Coram • Floral Park • Freeport • Hampton Bays • Inwood • Medford • Oceanside • Selden • Uniondale

#### **IMMIGRATION AND REFUGEE SERVICES**

Immigrants come to us fleeing persecution, seeking better opportunities, a better way of life, and family reunification. Catholic Charities helps them achieve self-sufficiency and become part of their new communities with a number of services. Our legal counseling program is recognized by the Executive Office for Immigration Review (EOIR) and our accredited representatives provide legal counseling, document preparation and representation on all matters before the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Service as well as in Immigration Court. Our refugee resettlement team works with the U.S. government, New York State and the U.S. Catholic Conference of Bishops to assist those fleeing war, natural disasters, or personal persecution in their homelands. Our Case Management team helps secure food, clothing, housing, and even counseling when necessary. Other services include language training, citizenship programs, employment services, and public policy advocacy. The Catholic Charities' Anti-Trafficking Program has worked with over 200 survivors of human trafficking and their families in both labor and sex trafficking cases and provides services for confirmed regional victims of human trafficking. In addition we work with the U.S. Department of Justice to provide legal orientation to custodians caring for unaccompanied minors. Our New York Services to At-Risk-Youth (NYSARY) program provides support for at-risk youth, with a focus on unaccompanied children entering the United States and living in Nassau and Suffolk counties. Our services include: medical and mental health support, addiction treatment, trauma and family counseling, English language instruction, and other community-based support services.

#### MENTAL HEALTH OUTPATIENT SERVICES

Whether it be the stresses of everyday life or serious, long-term disturbances, numerous Long Islanders need help coping with emotional difficulties. Catholic Charities helps steady their lives, reducing emotional pain and improving general well-being. As an alternative to institutional care, Catholic Charities provides individual, group, and family therapy with case management and support services at two community-based Mental Health Clinics in Suffolk County. Services are available to children, adolescents and adults. Each clinic has the capacity to treat in Spanish.

#### MENTAL HEALTH RESIDENTIAL SERVICES

Catholic Charities provides structured residential opportunities to adults struggling with mental illness. In these settings, residents can focus on getting well while developing their independent living skills. At Siena Residence, 12 adults with chronic mental illness work with counselors who assist them in pursuing employment, job training, independent housing, medication management, and socialization. Our Project Independence and Project Veterans Independence help homeless individuals and families coping with mental illness live independently within their communities by locating appropriate housing and offering ongoing support and counseling.

## NUTRITION OUTREACH EDUCATION PROGRAM (NOEP)

There are countless hungry individuals who are unaware of services and benefits that are accessible to them. Our Nutrition Outreach Education Program (NOEP) works to educate low-income Long Island families as to what food programs are available. We offer free, confidential pre-screening for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), formerly known as Food Stamps. We also offer application assistance for the program and advocacy to ensure that eligible families receive the benefits. Services are available both in local communities or through our NOEP offices in Nassau and Suffolk counties.

## RESIDENTIAL SERVICES FOR PEOPLE WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES

Catholic Charities operates 12 Individual Residential Alternatives (IRA's) serving more than 100 people in communities throughout Long Island. Our person-centered philosophy supports and encourages each individual to be as independent as possible while becoming active members of their communities. Our residents participate in a variety of activities including day habilitation programs, workshops, competitive employment and recreational outings. While in their home each person is encouraged to participate in general household chores, including food shopping, cooking, laundry, and overall house maintenance. Individuals are supported by our Direct Support Professionals (DSP's), who are specifically trained to meet their needs. #### **SENIOR SERVICES**

Senior citizens are one of the region's fastest-growing populations and our programs help them to continue living independently and safely at home while maintaining their physical and emotional health. The Expanded In-Home Services for the Elderly Program (EISEP)/Senior Case Management connects seniors with the services of government agencies, parishes, and community-based organizations. Meals-On-Wheels delivers nutritious meals to the homebound. Senior Community Service Centers offer meals, recreation, health services and socialization while Congregate Meal Sites provide meals and socialization, with one specifically for the visually impaired.

#### WOMEN, INFANTS AND CHILDREN (WIC)

In partnership with USDA and NYS Department of Health, our Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program is open to low-income pregnant, postpartum, and breastfeeding women and their children up to age five who are at nutritional risk. WIC provides food assistance, nutrition education, breastfeeding help, and health screenings with referrals to health care providers and human service agencies. Participants meet with a nutritionist to discuss the eating habits of their children and any concerns about their child's diet or growth. Breastfeeding information and support is available from peer counselors and trained WIC staff.
